Specifically, housing supply is still low, and demand is high. As mortgage rates started to rise this year, many homebuyers rushed to make their purchases before those rates could climb higher. The increased competition drove home prices up even more.

And experts say prices are forecast to continue appreciating, just at a more moderate pace moving forward. A recent article from Fortune says: "The swift move up in mortgage rates . . . doesn't mean home prices are about to crash. In fact, every major real estate firm with a publicly released forecast model . . . still predicts home prices will climb further this year."

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Backyard Grills Turn Up the Summer Heat



There's no better season than summer to turn up your grilling game with a new barbecue. Which type is right for you?

Charcoal Grill - Looking for an inexpensive grill that can easily be relocated around your backyard? A charcoal grill might be the best option for you. Although charcoal grills don't heat up as quickly as gas grills, they are

able to produce a nice smokey flavor and cook at a temperature of around 700 degrees Fahrenheit.

Gas Grill - The most popular type of grill, gas grills heat up quickly and provide a convenient push-button start for hassle-free lighting. You can also control the heat with a temperature control knob. Gas grills reach temperatures between 400 and 600 degrees Fahrenheit.

Pellet Grill - These types of grills provide the best of both worlds. Pellet grills are electrically powered and burn hardwood pellets for heat and generally produce a smokey flavor. They are also controlled by a temperature knob so you can cook between 160 and 600 degrees Fahrenheit.

Grilled Nectorine & Cheese Crostini

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 12 slices French bread baguette (1/4 inch thick)
- 2 medium nectarines, halved
- 1/4 cup fresh goat cheese, softened
- 1/4 cup loosely packed basil leaves, thinly sliced



Directions

- In a small saucepan, bring vinegar to a boil; cook
 10-15 minutes or until liquid is reduced to 3 tablespoons.
 Remove from heat.
- Brush oil over both sides of baguette slices. Grill, uncovered, over medium heat until golden brown on both sides. Grill nectarines 45-60 seconds on each side or until tender and lightly browned. Cool slightly.
- Spread goat cheese over toasts. Cut nectarines into thick slices; arrange over cheese. Drizzle with balsamic syrup; sprinkle with basil. Serve immediately.
