If you currently own a home and are considering a move, you may be wondering, "Should I buy a home first or sell a home first?" The answer is, it depends on a number of factors.

Some general factors to consider in evaluating your options are:

- Market conditions
- Financial resources & equity position in your current home
- Your tolerance for risk and the possibility of moving twice
- Your sense of urgency or flexibility with regards to timing

Determining the source and size of your down payment for the home you're buying is a critical step. Will it come from your current home or do you have other funds available? And how much equity do you have in your current home? To determine that, you'll need to know the approximate value first. Then you can subtract what you owe and the cost of selling to come up with your available equity. Once you have a good idea of equity, talk to a lender about your options. While many people who want to use their current home's equity to purchase their next home opt to sell first, there are some loan options that allow you to tap into your current home's equity and buy first.

Other factors to consider:

- Willingness to move twice •
- Options for temporary housing •
- How urgently you want or need to be in your new home
- How picky you are and what the inventory of homes is in the area and price range where you'll be looking
- How quickly you think your home will sell and the inventory of homes available in the area and price range where you'll be selling.

Selling First

Choosing to sell first can allow you to make a strong, non-contingent offer if you close escrow first, will allow you to know exactly what your net will be, and will ensure that you'll only have to pay one mortgage. However, if you don't have temporary housing lined up, it may mean you need to move twice. Building a contingency or rent-back period into your sale contract can help to ease the transition.

Buying First



Buying your next home before selling means you don't have to be in a rush to find the right place and you'll have the certainty of not giving up your current home before finding a replacement. You'll have more control over your timeline and the certainty of only having to make one move. Additionally, you can complete any work to the replacement home before moving in without feeling rushed. However, paying two mortgages can be a strain financially and you'll need to commit to a price on the new home without being certain of the net on your current home.

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Enjoy Fresh Herbs This Summer: How to Plant an Herb Container Garden

Use a high quality soil for planting, and make sure that if you're fertilizing, you do so sparingly and choose an organic one.

What to Grow?

Rosemary - Rosemary grows best in hot, dry, sunny spots. Rosemary is drought-tolerant so keep the soil moist. Be sure to water it especially when the soil feels dry. Keep your rosemary well pruned to assist its growth.

Basil - Basil is one of the most versatile herbs you can grow! It grows best in full sun and fertile, moist soil. Basil is a good companion with parsley, thyme, and other herbs when grown in a pot that holds at least 5 gallons of soil.

Mint - Mint is one of the easiest plants you can grow and a great start for beginners. It can grow in many soil types and degrees of sunlight, but it produces the best leaves in rich soil. Mint will spread if planted in the ground, so a container is best for this hearty herb!

Dill - Dill is another great plant for beginners. It tolerates the heat and cooler places (although it won't grow as well if placed in the shade). Water it regularly and weed it often for a full, bushy, dill plant. It can be used in a variety of dishes including salads, vegetables, meats, and sauces.
